General Program Overview

Established in 1965, the Home of Grace Addiction Recovery Program is dedicated to helping individuals find freedom from addiction through a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

This three-month residential program addresses the spiritual, emotional and physical aspects of recovery. Hope is restored, lives are changed, careers saved and families reconciled. We rejoice with the admission of every man and woman entering this program because we recognize the opportunity to end the tragic cycle of addiction.

A dedicated team of teachers, counselors, ministers, office personnel and volunteers take seriously their commitment to love, serve and guide men and women through this program. This is accomplished through in-depth Bible-based and educational curriculum, individual and group counseling, devotions, work program, recreational and physical fitness activities.

Statement of Faith and Conduct

1. We hold the Bible to be God's Holy Word in its entirety and inspired in every part by the Holy Spirit.
2. We hold that man was created in the image of God, holy and innocent; that of his own choice, he sinned, and, as a result, brought death upon all humanity. Those who are not saved from sin are eternally separated from God.
3. We hold that Jesus Christ is God, born of a virgin. That He gave His life on the cross where He, who knew no sin, was made sin for us; that He was buried and rose again from the dead, afterward He ascended into Heaven, and that He will come again.
4. We believe that God offers redemption and restoration to all who confess and forsake their sin, seeking His mercy and forgiveness through Jesus Christ.
5. We hold that we are saved by grace through faith, apart from works, that the sinner who repents and personally accepts that finished work of Christ on the cross becomes a child of God, is made a new creature, and is indwelt by the Holy Spirit.
6. We believe that the term 'marriage' has only one meaning and that is marriage sanctioned by God which joins one man and one woman in a single, exclusive union, as delineated in Scripture.

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Medical Policy

Required Medical Tests Prior to Check-In

- **TB Test Results** (not more than one year old)
- **Proof of HIV Testing**

Medical Criteria

- ✓ We are **not** a medical facility and cannot provide medically supervised detoxification.
- ✓ Client must be physically detoxed and able to participate in required daily activities prior to enrollment. Those unable to participate in daily activities **will be dismissed**.
- ✓ Client must disclose any physical, emotional, mental, or health condition that might restrict or limit their participation in the recovery program. **Failure to do so may result in dismissal.**
- ✓ Volunteer medical personnel will assist clients with minor ailments during program.
- ✓ Client is responsible for costs of any off-campus emergency medical, dental or transportation cost.
- ✓ Out of state Medicaid is not accepted for medical appointments or prescription refills. Prior arrangements should be made before entering the program to provide these services.

Medications

All medications must be pre-approved prior to check-in and turned in upon arrival.

Approved Medications

- ✓ **Pain Reliever** - Tylenol, Naproxen, Motrin, Ibuprofen, Aleve
- ✓ **Stomach Medication** - Prilosec OTC, Nexium, Prevacid, Tums, Roloids, Pepto Bismol
- ✓ **Cold, Cough or Sinus Medication** - Claritin, Chlortabs, Tylenol Cold & Sinus (all non- drowsy), Alka Seltzer Plus Cold Daytime, Mucinex, Alcohol Free Cough Syrup, Tussin CF, Cough Drops

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Important Policies and Guidelines

Postpone ALL Legal and Medical Obligations

Prior to enrollment, it is the responsibility of the client to have all legal and medical appointments postponed until completion of the three-month program. **Failure to do so may result in dismissal.**

Daily Schedule

Monday – Friday

Devotions, Scheduled Classes (Bible, Educational, GED, Personal Enrichment, Life Skills and Career Planning), Work Detail, Individual and Group Counseling, Recreational Activities and Evening Chapel Service.

Saturday

Recreation, Evening Chapel Service, Personal Enrichment Classes.

Sunday

Morning and Evening Chapel Service.

Recreational Activities

Staff-approved videos, basketball, volleyball, exercise equipment, choir, swimming, and fishing.

Clients are expected to comply with all program rules, procedures and participate in daily schedule of activities, including the work program (maintenance of grounds, buildings, etc.)

Client Code Number

Every client is assigned a Client Code Number for their privacy and protection. It is the responsibility of the client to notify others of their code number.

Phone Calls and Communication

Phone usage is a privilege. Clients are encouraged to send and receive letters. During Phase 1 of the program, all phone calls are at the discretion of the counselor. During Phase 2, clients will be given one 15 minute phone slot per week. Clients are unable to receive phone calls, faxes or emails. Clients are not allowed to have cell phones under any circumstances.

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Mail and Packages

Incoming and outgoing mail and packages will be monitored. Clients are not allowed to receive food or drink items through the mail. Food and drink items may be brought at visitation. **Dropped off items are strictly prohibited.** Clients without visitors will be allowed additional items mailed by family or delivered via Walmart or Amazon as approved by or coordinated through their counselor.

Tobacco Policy

Although clients are strongly encouraged to quit smoking and dipping, limited smoking and smokeless tobacco (in pouches only) are allowed in **designated areas only**. Nicotine patches and gum are encouraged. No eCigs or Vapors of any kind are allowed.

Transportation

Transportation can be arranged (prior to intake) for clients arriving at the Greyhound Bus Station (Biloxi), Gulfport-Biloxi Regional Airport, or the Mobile, AL International Airport for an additional mileage fee (subject to staff availability and potential arrival time).

Scheduled Intake

Once a date is scheduled for enrollment, we request that you arrive **on time** for your intake appointment. If late or absent, your appointment may need to be rescheduled **for an additional fee**. Animals are not allowed during intake. It is not recommended to bring children during this intake process. Persons bringing you into the program should be prepared to stay during the entire intake process which may take up to 2 hours.

Rescheduling an intake will require a non-refundable deposit of \$500 before booking.

Family Visitation

Visitation is scheduled on the first Saturday of every month from 11:30 AM to 3:30 PM and is reserved for **family only**: spouse, parents, grandparents, brothers, sisters and children. **Fiancés and girlfriends are not considered immediate family.** Not more than 5 adult visitors. Strict guidelines established for visitors, incoming items, etc. Clients allowed one (1) sealed 120 quart container of items at visitation. Ministerial visits are scheduled weekdays by appointment only with counselor approval. No pets (except certified service animals).

Program Fee

The program fee is \$3,000 for the three-month residential program. Donations and other resources enable us to offer this program for significantly less than the actual cost. Full payment is required **at the time of intake**. **No refunds will be offered for any reason.**

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Items to Bring

Due to limited space, the overall amount of items brought in should be minimal. On-campus vending machines are available for residents to purchase snacks and drinks during the program. Clients may have credit cards, debit cards and/or prepaid cards for use of vending machines. Laundry machines are coin operated requiring quarters. Clients are responsible for managing their own funds.

Identification Documents

Picture ID or Driver's License, Social Security Card, Insurance Card

Linens

Twin size sheets, blanket, pillow, towels, washcloths.

Laundry

Money for coin operated laundry.

Personal Items

Ibuprofen or tylenol, shampoo, soap, toothpaste, mouthwash (alcohol free), hairspray (non-aerosol and alcohol-free ONLY), alarm clock (no radio), clothes hangers, laundry detergent, stamps and envelopes, wrist-watch, cartridge razors or electric clippers.

Classroom Supplies

Bible, backpack or bookbag, pen, highlighters (no permanent markers), notebook, three-prong pocket folder, and index cards.

Clothing

All clothes are to be men's clothes. Men are required to wear shirts with sleeves from 7am to 4:30pm. While in all buildings, shirts with sleeves (short or long) are required. Hats are not to be worn inside. Men are encouraged to bring shoes, boots for working, works clothes, dress clothes, and activewear.

Locked Valuables

Combination or key padlock for your locker.

Optional Items

Snacks (vending machines on campus), clip-on reading lamp, recreation equipment, board games, mattress pad, bedside rug, umbrella, hair dryer, etc.

The Home of Grace is not responsible for lost, damaged or abandoned items.

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Prohibited Items

- X Drugs, alcohol, non-approved medication
- X Any items with broken seals
- X Anything containing alcohol: mouthwash, cologne, etc.
- X Aerosol items: hair spray, canned whip cream, etc.
- X Pocket knife or any item that could be considered a weapon
- X Cell Phone, Camera, Computer, iPod or Radio
- X Non-approved books, videos, magazines, music or curriculum from other treatment programs.
- X No facial or body jewelry allowed. Please remove before intake.
- X No cross-gender clothing or reference to alcohol, gambling, tobacco or profanity
- X No eCigs or vapors
- X No rolling papers or smokeless/loose tobacco in any form other than pouches
- X No loose powder of any kind
- X No energy drinks, diet aids, supplements, herbal tea or powdered drink mixes
- X No personal vehicles
- X No pets
- X No hot plates, toasters, crock pots, cookers, or candles, etc
- X No standard playing cards
- X No open boxes of stationery
- X No unsealed food, drinks or medications

The Home of Grace strives to protect all clients from negative influences. Therefore, staff reserves the right to make discretionary decisions concerning peculiar clothing, hair style or color, etc.

It is imperative that prohibited items are not brought on campus as they are harmful to the individual who brings them as well as to others in the program. Violators are subject to **immediate dismissal**.

Agreement

I have fully read and understand all policies, requirements and restrictions outlined in this packet, and I accept that failure to comply will result in immediate dismissal without refund.
